"Extending our capabilities to assist our friends and neighbors in the community is an important part of our culture and a role that we take great pride in serving."

Organizations that are interesting in applying for donations or inquiring about purchasing masks at cost are asked to complete a form on the company website that details the number requested and their on - going needs. Donations will be prioritized for non-profits and organizations that demonstrate significant need within Central Pennsylvania. As supplies dictate, organizations in other U.S. communities where Hershey has key operations may apply for donations or potentially make purchases of masks at cost.

Converting operations to address the critical need for facemasks is the latest step in the company's ongoing efforts to support communities during the COVID-19 pandemic. To date, Hershey has donated millions in cash and product to benefit community safety net organizations including numerous food banks and a variety of healthcare organizations.
